OVERDOSE PREVENTION AND SAFETY





SIGNS OF OVERDOSE

- · Unresponsive to voice or touch
- · Shallow, slow, or no breathing
- · Small pupils "pinpoint pupils"
- · Blue or gray lips/nails
- · Gurgling or snoring



RESPONSE

- Check for breathing and signs of opioid overdose
- 2. Lay the person on the back, give naloxone (Narcan Nasal Spray)
 - > PEEL back the package, remove the device
 - > PLACE the tip of the nozzle in the nose until the finger touch the bottom of the nose
 - > PRESS the plunger firmly to release the dose
- 3. Call 911
- 4. Provide rescue breathing (1 breath every 6 seconds)
- 5. Repeat naloxone (Narcan Nasal Spray) every 2-3 minutes if no response
- Stay with the person until help arrives. If you must leave them, place the person on their side.

RISK FACTORS

- · Previous overdose
- · Period of abstinence or illness (i.e.,

following rehab, jail, or hospitalization)

- Change in strength, amount, supplier, or location of use
- Mixing opioids with other substances (benzos, sedatives, alcohol)
- · Using alone
- · Use by injection



PREVENTION TIPS

 If you do use, do not use alone, avoid mixing substances, start small.

be cautious when sick or after a period of abstinence

- · Keep naloxone available, do not let it freeze
- If you inject, use clean equipment every time including the cooker, cotton, and syringe.
- Treat every dose like it may have fentanyl in it.
 Use fentanyl test strips to test the product if available.

LOCK

Keep medication out of sight and in a safe and secure place



MONITOR Keep track of

medication and only take as directed



TAKEBACK

Drop off unused medication at a Take Back location including most Grand Forks pharmacies
